## **PUBLIC NOTICE**

### **DEFINITION OF BROADBAND IN LESOTHO**

The LTA Board of Directors in its meeting of the 19<sup>th</sup> July, 2007 resolved that the definition of Broadband in Lesotho should be as follows:

“An always on data connection that is able to support interactive services and has the capability of supporting data rates equal or greater than the ISDN primary rate of 2 Mbps to the curb and Committed Information Rate (CIR) of minimum 256 kbps to the end-user”.

The underlining aspects in this definition are: “an always on data connection”, “capability to support interactive services” and the minimum bandwidth requirement of “2 Megabits per second (2 Mbps) to the curb and minimum CIR of 256 kbps to the end-user”.

All other applications or services not fully meeting the above parameters may otherwise be referred to as “high speed internet/applications”.
